Watering Plants During the Hot Summer Months

Over the summer we are likely to deal with hot, humid temperatures and periods with little to no rain. During these times, proper watering of gardens, flowers, trees, and shrubs is very important. Most of our plants prefer to have 1 inch of water per week. When we have rain, that is very helpful, but in the summer, it is quite common to have to substitute water. I often get asked, when is the best time of day to water? The answer to that is early morning. This allows the plants to go into the day fully hydrated and better prepared for the hot temperatures and it also helps to keep the water from evaporating too quickly, before the plants can take it up. Obviously, early morning watering doesn't work for everyone's schedule, so sometimes you just have to do the best you can! Watering in the evening is not recommended. The water doesn't have



time to be used or evaporate before the cooler nighttime temperatures come, and that environment can lead to increased fungal growth and rot on plants.

The key to proper watering is to water deeply, but infrequently. One of my favorite methods for watering gardens or flower beds is to use a soaker hose. This looks like a regular garden hose, but it has perforations in it, and when you hook it up to a spicket, the water goes through and gently trickles throughout all those little holes. This allows you to water slowly and at the base of the plant, where your water will be going directly to the root system. These soaker hoses can be found in about any garden section of stores and I highly recommend them. You can place them out at the beginning of the season and remove them after each watering, or keep them there for the season, just hooking them up when they need to be used.

One final thought is to only water when it is needed. In the summertime, we don't usually have to overthink it, if in doubt in the hot temps, it usually needs water! But it is always a good idea to do a finger test before watering. Place your finger down into the soil and if the tip of your finger reaches a damp area, you are usually okay to wait on the watering. However, if the soil is dry all the way to your fingertip, it's time to give it a drink! Good luck this summer and happy gardening!



Blackberry Basil Grilled Cheese

1 ½ cups fresh blackberries12-14 fresh basil leaves, chopped2 tablespoons olive oil

In a large bowl, **mash** blackberries and basil with a fork. **Heat** an electric griddle or large skillet over medium-low heat. **Sprinkle** griddle or skillet with olive oil. **Place** bread on skillet. **Add** a slice of cheese and blackberry mixture. **Place** a second piece of bread on top of cheese and blackberries. **Cook** 3-5 minutes or one side. **Flip. Cook** 3-5 minutes or

- 8 slices of multigrain bread
- **4** slices cheese, such as Munster

until both sides are brown and cheese has melted.
